Field Notes: Rev. C. Richards

There's a line from the ancient Chinese book, the Tao-te-Ching that I often think of as I consider how to live with my neighbor. In it, Lao-tse, the author (via Stephen Mitchell the translator) describes a master of the way of the Tao as being "fluid as melting ice." The section goes like this:

"The ancient masters were profound and subtle. Their wisdom unfathomable. There is no way to describe it; All we can do is describe their appearance. They were as careful as someone crossing an iced-over stream. Alert as a Warrior in enemy territory. Courteous as a guest. Fluid as melting ice. Shapable as a block of wood. Receptive as a valley."

I often imagine the senses involved in this description of wisdom, grace, and humility; especially the description, "Fluid as melting ice". Melting ice is such a fascinating material. Slick with water, impossible to hold, yet solid and strong, all the while filling the space around it gradually as it flexes under pressure. You don't see it move, but when you look back, it has done just that.

The Tao-te-Ching is an ancient book of philosophy, describing a way to live with gentleness, goodness, and honesty. It is not a religious text, but rather a practical treatise on living a life of harmony with others. As a Christian, I have often found its wisdom to be complementary to our goal of living in harmony with others while also keeping a close relationship with Jesus who is our way and our truth and our life. When I am thinking of gracious ways to respond to a brother or sister in Christ, Stephen Mitchell's translation of the Tao often comes to mind in concert with sections of Matthew 18 and Romans.

This time of year, that image – fluid as melting ice takes on a concrete meaning. Everything continues to melt – especially after a warm week last week as I write this. Water seeps in here and there, slick surfaces and mud show up, as do all the things buried in the snow over the season. In our minds, as everything is released from the snow and slowly dries out, we have an image of what spring will be and how our yards and homes should be when the transition is over.

I wonder – is Faith life like the changing of the season from winter to summer? We have an image of what a good life may be – we follow Jesus who encourages us while also saving us for this summertime life. We see how it can be, and we endeavor to put things in order so that when summer arrives, everything is ready. But to do so, we have an image of the core, of the solid center of ourselves and of our world when summer arrives, or else how would we know where to put the chairs or when to finally plant the flowers?

I wonder if part of our life of Faith is to receive the image Jesus gives us good life with one another and God, and make it central in our hearts. The Spirit does this work as well. Then as we make our way, knowing what is real and solid, we are able to move carefully in the world, strong yet adaptable, focused yet free. Fluid as melting ice. Christ's peace as spring arrives, and careful on the ice!
